Charles Towne Landing State Historic Site (CTL)

We are very pleased to hold LDS at **Founders Hall** located at Charles Towne Landing once again. **Charles Towne Landing State Historic Site** sits on a marshy point, located off of the Ashley River, where a group of English settlers landed in 1670 and established what would become the birthplace of the Carolina colony.

The grounds include 80 acres of gardens, with an elegant live oak allée and the Legare-Waring House. Founders Hall is a state-of-the-art facility and LEED certified building with ample parking on site.

Restoration of George Washington's Mt. Vernon Gardens

Celebrate America's 250th with Dean Norton, Mt. Vernon's Director of Horticulture Emeritus. With over a 5-decade association with Mt. Vernon, Dean's engaging presentation will highlight the efforts to faithfully restore the gardens and meticulously preserve the landscapes of Washington's beloved home.

- Program Curriculum -

Through the Ages: Historical View of Landscape Design

Garden Historian/Designer Karen Prewitt will be leading us through the development of landscape design including Egyptian, Mesopotamian, Medieval, Islamic, Renaissance and Victorian influences.

Space, Design and People

Parks Director Kellen Goodell will discuss creating landscapes that are both functional and aesthetically pleasing with a view of how renowned designer Piet Oudolf approaches this topic.

Developing Your Garden Plan & Basics of a Site Plan

Landscape Architects Marie Frier & Allen McDonald will speak to the process and tools professionals use to develop garden plans and how homeowners may use similar processes in creating plans for their own properties.

Learning About Your Ecosystem

Our neighborhoods are environments that include all life from fungus to the tallest trees. Restoration Ecologist Rebecca Fanning will discuss learning about our natural ecosystems as a foundation before trying to create landscapes that are artificial ecosystems.

Color in the Landscape

Color attracts the eye and draws the attention of the viewer. Garden Designer Linda Greenberg will present how color from foliage, flowers, bark, or hardscape can be introduced into the garden to enhance a given design.

Water Wise Gardening

Be it Drought, Rain or Flood, South Carolina has it all. Ecologist and Educator Sharleen Johnson will address water wise gardening. Be it in selecting the right plant for the right place or simple design techniques to effectively utilize your local environment.

Design for the Environment

Landscape Designer and Horticulturist Beverly Rivers will deep dive into Plant ecology including natives, nativars, non-native exotics and invasive species and their impact on your landscape and the environment.

- Course Schedule -

Course 1 is the first of four courses in Series 18 of the Landscape Design Study Program. Courses may be taken out of sequence and in any state.

Check-in registration begins Tuesday morning at 8:30 with the program beginning promptly at 9:00. Lunch will be provided to all students who may choose from regular, vegetarian or gluten free offerings. The Tuesday program will adjourn at 5:00 PM.

Wednesday registration will begin at 8:30 with the program beginning at 9:00. Presentations should be finished at about 1:00 at which time we will adjourn. Students taking the exam will stay for lunch which will be followed by the exam. Typically, the exam will take about 15-20 minutes to complete.

For those of you who are wishing to spend the night, there are many hotels in the Historic District, West Ashley, Mt. Pleasant and North Charleston. Charles Towne Landing is conveniently and centrally located to all areas.

- Historic Home & Garden Tours -

- NGC Consultant Certification -

The School program is offered as a service to the public, but only members of a club federated with the National Garden Clubs Inc. are eligible to become NGC Landscape Consultants. All members who successfully complete all four courses with exam results at 70% or higher will qualify for the title of National Garden Clubs (NGC) "Landscape Design Consultant."

Out of state students who are members of a NGC affiliated club may also receive certification credit for completing this course and exam. Please request an official record from your State School Chair.

To remain in Good Standing, Consultants may Refresh after one year, but must refresh before five years from the date of achieving Consultant status. They must attend all lectures, but do not need to take the examination. After a Consultant's fourth refresher they achieve Master Consultant status.

Nonmembers may complete the courses and the exam, join an NGC garden club within a year from the last course, and become an NGC "Landscape Design Consultant."

All Garden Club of South Carolina Landscape Design Consultants also automatically become a member of the GCSC Consultants Council.
